<u>FY23 Grad Reports</u> - A Newsflash went out this morning that Grad reports have been moved to G. Historically we have published these reports in S until that collection closed, but we have a need to produce them in G, and it is easier for ODE to move them to G. Districts should see them this morning in G as soon as reports populate (Data collectors had to be restarted this morning due to a ZIS outage over the weekend, so it may take a little time for everything to populate). The plan for next year (FY24) is to move the Grad reports to G as soon as that collection opens (May 2024).

<u>Data Collector Messages</u> - Chad mentioned the WOCO message "bounced back" this morning, so hopefully someone from WOCO is on the call; WOCO please contact Chad.

<u>SDC Reports and Acceleration</u> - A Newsflash went out last week regarding the way accelerated students were counting and incorrectly showing a proficiency bump. Due to a bug in the logic there was a bump up from students counting as accelerated who were not. This has been resolved and verified over the weekend. Now that extra bump for accelerated students in performance index and performance bump is no longer happening.

FY24 Reporting - This reporting is beginning very soon. The processing calendar will be out in the next couple of days with all dates. On Monday, July 3rd, FY24 Student Cross Reference and FY24 Initial Calendar collections will open. ODE will be closed on Tuesday, July 4th, but is open on Monday, July 3rd.

<u>FY23 Reporting</u> - In about 3 weeks the FY23 collections begin to close; Student Cross Reference closes July 14th, the main Student Collections (S/SOES) and State Assessment Collections (3-8/EOC) close on July 19th. ODE has seen the volume of assessment data submitted increasing steadily - over 1 million records submitted in one day last week; those submissions are appreciated.

<u>Retirements</u> - This is the final EMIS ITC Conference Call before June 30th and there are some folks who are retiring - shout out to them for all they've done. It is appreciated!

They had received info from their ESC that acceleration numbers are incorrect; they should include students who are taking a higher grade level assessment, but they are not seeing that. Is this correct, or do they require a written acceleration plan to count?
