FY23H Financial Appeals – Districts that filed appeals have until 5pm this Friday, October 6, to submit corrected EMIS data.

FY23H Financial Data Review – Treasurers are required to sign off on their financial data by next Friday, October 13: <https://education.ohio.gov/Topics/Data/EMIS/Reporting-Responsibilities/EMIS-Data-Review-Verification>

FY23G Graduate Collection – closes next Friday, October 13. ODE sent reminder emails to ITCs again this morning for those LEAs who have not yet submitted.

FY24 Changes – Open for public comment: #24-96 “Home Schooling” changed to “Home Education” and #24-97 “Blizzard Bag” changed to “Online Day” (still reported using the existing C_DBLZZARD element but instructions on when this can be reported have changed). FY25 Changes – There are already several FY25 changes, so this page will be available soon.

New Files – Additional files related to curriculum coding for Science and Social Studies courses and credits will be coming out in the *Data Collector > Reports > Received Files* this week. Files will contain SSIDs for last year’s students so that information can be corrected for high school credit reporting this year and beyond. Look for an EMIS Newsflash announcing these two files this week.

1. Social Studies file will contain students who appeared to have completed a World History course but didn’t get reported with ½ credit for ‘SWH’ as expected. A lot of students appeared to have been incorrectly reported with Social Studies Other (SOO) *Subject Area for Credit* instead of Social Studies World History (SWH) [see EMIS Change #23-100].
2. Science file will provide information on misreporting of Advanced Science (SCA) *Subject Area for Credit*. This code is not to be used for credits earned after FY22 (replaced with SAE, SAL, SAP per EMIS Change #23-21) , but ODE didn’t put in the check last year. The check is now there so reporting ‘SCA’ will result in fatal errors this year.

Q&A

Q: Are Special Ed Related Service program codes expected to be reported as of the first of the year or only as IEP events take place this year? Example, if a student had an IEP last April, do we report those related service codes this year or do we only report related service codes once THIS year’s IEP is held?

A: We need to get confirmation from the business office.

Q: On the Level 2 *Potential College Credit Report*, for CTAG and AP courses, are you expecting schools to report the college credit for all of those?

A: ‘Expecting’ is too strong of a word. This is just making them aware that if they have students that they expect to get to the 12-credit requirement (which is part of a report card measure), there are multiple pathways for students to get those points. A lot of students bound for college may have already met part of that measure, but if a student has not met the measure and you think they may be able to meet it through credits, this is letting districts know where there might be some additional

credits to report. To report those, they will have to reach out to the student and get that information. This is more about if districts have additional students that they want to get credit for, this is helping to show where they could be getting that credit. CCP is a little different in that report, because they definitely already did earn the credit while they were enrolled in the KG-12 entity, so those credits should definitely be reported in their GC record.

Q: On the Level 2 *Potential College Credit Report*, if a student has result code GR0003 (“Student may have additional college credit to report”), does that mean the district did report the CCP credit but the university did not?

A: It could be that credit was reported in a different Subject Area for Credit, or the student is earning credit that might be outside one of the programs we manage or can infer based on the data we have. This report doesn’t mean something is definitely wrong but is just to make sure college credit is reported as completely as possible.
